Professor Pasley will entertain us with a historical look at how our industry has evolved from the Egyptian and Greek times to our own nation's history. Jim serves as a Professor of American and European History at Columbia College where he has taught for the past 26 years. He teaches 19 different courses, some of which include 19th & 20th Century Europe, The History of Russia, The American Revolution, American History, History of the American West, US Military History, and The Civil War.

He was named Professor of the Year at Columbia College in 1992 and again in 1995. In May of 2000 he was the recipient of the Missouri Governor's Award for Quality and Productivity. In 2012 he was honored by the Columbia College National Alumni Association as Distinguished Alumni of the Year. Jim also serves as the Director of the Columbia College Lake of the Ozarks Advisory Board. In addition to his duties with the college, Jim does a weekly call in radio show in the Lake of the Ozarks area on 1150 AM and 97.5 FM station KRMS called "The Morning Magazine" that brings a historical perspective to current events impacting our daily lives.
